In 2022 the Foundation continued our tradition of supporting the Annual Meeting of the American College of Epidemiology. Our fourth annual Endowed Lecture was given by Dr. Jonine Berstein. Dr. Bernstein is an Attending Epidemiologist and Co-Leader of the Population Sciences Research Program at the Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center in Manhattan, New York.

Dr. Jonine Bernstein was honored to give the 2022 ACE Foundation Fellows Lecture. Her talk, entitled "The Genetic Epidemiology of Contralateral Breast Cancer (CBC): Insights from the WECARE Study", highlighted what we know, and don't know about the etiology of CBC, and described some of the WECARE Study results of rare and common genetic mutations associated with risk of developing CBC and radiation-associated CBC in particular. About 1 in 8 US women (about 12.4%) will develop invasive breast cancer over their lifetime, and yet only a fraction of breast cancer survivors, about 5%, will develop a second primary in the contralateral breast. As CBC is a rare event it is difficult to study and as a result, unlike first primary breast cancer, only a few etiologic risk factors have been consistently identified; these risk factors are primarily early age at diagnosis of a first breast cancer, strong family history, and a few genetic mutations. The treatment a woman receives can also affect her risk of developing CBC, chemotherapy and tamoxifen have been shown to reduce the risk while radiation treatment has been found to increase the risk.
